Students will learn to configure and diagnose hardware and software as well as how to connect network devices and understand Cyber-Security practices.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Veterinary Assisting</b></p> <p>This program trains students to assist Veterinarians and other Veterinary professionals in the care of animal patients. Students will gain hands-on experience in lab skills and will have opportunities for experiences in animal husbandry, grooming and daily pet care.</p>

<p><i>What do you learn in this program?</i></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Firefighter I/II</b> (Evening &amp; Saturday class @ Hillsborough County Fire Rescue)</p> <p>In this program, students learn the knowledge and skills needed for the Florida Minimum Standards Fire Fighter exam and prepare for entry level jobs as Fire Fighters.</p> <p><b><u>Pre-requisite:</u> Must hold a valid EMT license to enroll in this program.</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><i>In the planning stages ...</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Public Safety Telecommunication (911 Dispatcher)</b></p> <p>The purpose of this program is to prepare students for employment as a dispatcher for police, fire and ambulance services. Students will receive instruction designed to prepare them for the Florida 911 Public Safety Telecommunicator exam.</p>
<p><i>What are the entrance requirements?</i></p>	<p>Complete a short application at the campus. You will need to show your HS diploma (or GED) and residency documents. You may need to meet specific TABE scores (basic skills in Math/Language/Reading) prior to graduation. See a Program Advisor for details.</p>	
<p><i>When does the next class start?</i></p>	<p style="text-align: center;">August 13, 2019</p>	<p>We are in the process of obtaining all agency approvals to start this program. We hope to be ready to go in August 2019. Call the school office in June for updates.</p>
<p><i>How long is the program?</i></p>	<p>398 hours, plus 52 hours local requirement. This program meets 3 evenings and all day Saturday, taking approx. 5-6 months to complete.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">232 hours</p> <p>This program will be taught in the evenings and will take approximately 4 months to complete.</p>
<p><i>What does the program cost?</i></p>	<p>Approx. \$2,800 (includes tuition, textbooks, materials, most bunker gear, and state exam)</p>	<p>Approx. \$800 (includes tuition, textbooks, materials, supplies, and state exam)</p>
